During an informal (wine reception) session members are invited to present current projects (not necessarily related to congress topic).

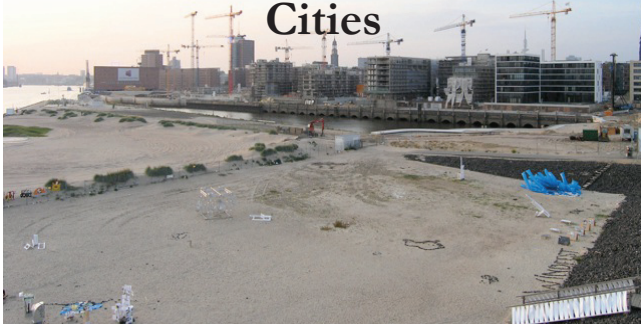

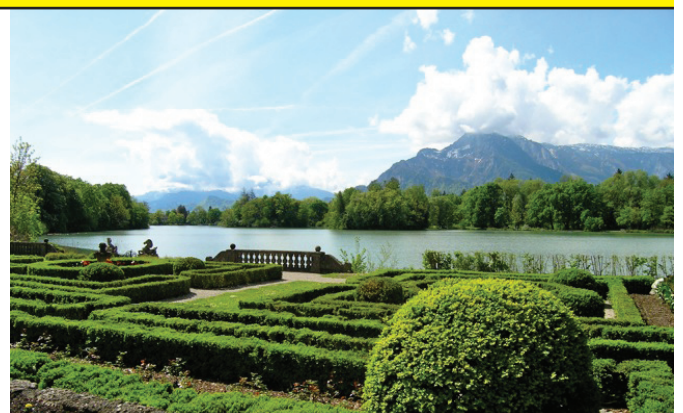

Academics, researchers and practitioners are invited to submit a poster presentation (one poster 50 x 70

cm) addressing the topic. Posters will be selected with regard to three criteria:

- contribution to the aims and topic of the conference,
- capacity to address the questions raised, and
- originality of research, results and conclusions.
